## Acceptance Deposit

An acceptance deposit of £500 per pupil is payable upon confirmation of acceptance of a place at the College. This is only returned on completion of Year 6 or Year 13 at St Joseph's. Alternatively, if you prefer, you may donate the deposit to the College's Transforming Lives Bursary Fund.

## Tuition Fees

Fees are usually reviewed for the beginning of each academic year at the discretion of the Governors, and parents are given as much notice as possible of any increases.

The fees for the academic year commencing September 2022 are as follows:

St Joseph's operates a direct debit scheme for payment of fees. Payment is taken in advance in ten equal monthly instalments from July to April inclusive, with a payment holiday in May and June.



## Payment of Fees and Extras

Parents will receive a schedule in June each year, which will outline the yearly Tuition Fees. For pupils in Pre-Reception to Year 9 this will also include lunches. At the end of each term, parents will receive a statement of account detailing payments received to date.

Towards the end of each term the fees for the current term's 'Extras' (including optional lessons and extended day charges) will be calculated and an invoice will be issued.

A final reconciliation will be performed at the end of the academic year and a final invoice will be issued.

## Fees Refund Scheme

The College has a scheme in place which enables it, in specified circumstances, to refund basic tuition fees if the pupil is absent from school through sickness, accident or quarantine. If you wish to take up this option, a charge of 1.37% of the basic tuition fee will be added to the pupil's fee account. Information and application forms are sent to parents with the autumn term invoice.

## Means-Tested Fee Assistance

St Joseph's College prides itself on trying to keep its fees accessible to as many families as possible. We know that there are some children, who would benefit from our

educational offer, who might not be able to afford the full fee. For these families there is the opportunity to apply for means-tested fee assistance. These offers are limited in number and are available to those joining the Senior School only. See our website for further details.

For current pupils in the Senior School, financial support may also be provided where parents experience financial difficulties. Please contact the Bursar for further information.

## Optional Lessons

Optional lessons in music, speech and drama (LAMDA), and ballet (Prep pupils only), are available, on the basis of 30 lessons in a full year, as follows:

Individual tuition	£240 per term
Shared tuition (2)	£146 per term
Group tuition (ballet)	£86 per term

One term's notice is required for cancellation.

## Learning Support Sessions

Costs are based on a full term of sessions, available to Senior School pupils only.

30 minutes	£37 per session
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### Pre-Reception Minimum Attendance

The majority of children joining Pre-Reception attend full time. However, we are happy for children to start on a part time basis, moving towards full time attendance as parents and teachers feel is appropriate.

The minimum weekly attendance for children in Pre-Reception is five mornings (8.20am to 1.00pm) or three full school days (8.20am to 3.20pm).

Our expectation is that most children will be attending full time by the summer term of Pre-Reception to prepare for transition to Reception in September.

### Childcare Vouchers/Tax-Free Childcare

St Joseph's College participates in the current government salary sacrifice childcare voucher scheme, and will also accept payments via the new Tax-Free Childcare scheme.

Both schemes can be used to pay for:

- School fees for children aged 3 to 5
- Extended Day for children aged 3 to 11
- St Joseph's College Holiday Club

St Joseph's accepts Childcare Vouchers from all the main suppliers. Please contact the Finance Office for more information on reference numbers and on which elements of fees these vouchers can be used against.

### Early Years Funding

For three and four year olds, parents can claim Early Years Funding to help cover the cost of fees. Funding is available for 38 weeks of the year. St Joseph's College offers this funding for up to 15 hours per week.

Funding is given from the term after your child turns three to the term after they turn five, based on cut off dates of 31 August, 31 December and 31 March to avoid variation in actual term dates.

### Essential Equipment

Certain items of essential equipment are supplied to pupils at different stages in the school, the cost of which is charged on the first or next fee bill, as follows:

Pupils entering the Senior School will be supplied with essential books and equipment at a cost of approximately £45.

## Public Examination Fees

The cost of fees charged by the various examining boards is charged on the fee bill in the year in which the examination is being taken.

## Book Deposit

In order to relieve parents of the burden of purchasing all the necessary text books, the school makes a termly charge for providing them. For Years 10 and 11, £15 per term is charged for each of the six terms (a total of £90). Provided that all books are returned at the end of Year 11 this amount is fully refunded. During Years 12 and 13 the deposit is £20 per term and provided all books are returned, the amount (£120) is fully refunded at the end of Year 13.

Where books are not returned or are damaged there will be a deduction from the refund to cover the cost of replacement.

For parents of pupils in Year 11 or Year 13 please note text books must be returned by the end of the summer term. Once the books are received the book deposit will be refunded. Alternatively, if you prefer, you may donate the deposit to the Transforming Lives Bursary Fund which will be used to assist pupils to attend the College where their parents are unable to afford the full fees.

## Meals

Meals are served daily in the College Dining Hall. There is a cafeteria service and pupils can choose from a wide range of hot or cold snack dishes.

All Prep pupils are expected to have a school lunch and are provided with a healthy snack for their morning break. A daily charge for this of £3.75 is added to your invoice. Breakfast and tea are provided as part of the Extended Day.

For Years 7, 8 and 9, school lunch is compulsory and a daily charge of £4.10 is added to your invoice. Compulsory lunch will extend to Year 10 from September 2023-24.

For Years 10 to 13 there is a set charge of £4.10 for lunch. Pupils may also purchase breakfast, a snack at break time and tea at a cost of £2.10 each. The purchase of these items is recorded on the cashless payment system and the charges are added to the termly invoices.



## Extended Day

The Prep School is open from 8.00am to 6.00pm. Supervised breakfast is available in the College Dining Hall from 7.45am.

After school sessions run until 5.15pm or 6.00pm and include afternoon tea. Children have opportunities to take part in a variety of structured activities, play games and the opportunity to do their homework. Each evening, sports activities, run by qualified instructors, are also offered.

Bookings for Extended Day are made on My School Portal. Prices are £8.90 until 5:15pm and £13.30 until 6.00pm.

Additional fees will be applied at the rate of £15 per 15 minutes or part thereof for collections after 6.00pm.

Bookings received after 12.00pm on the day will attract a 50% surcharge. No refunds will be given for cancellations less than 24 hours in advance.

## Holiday Club

St Joseph's Holiday Club runs for every full week of the holidays (with the exception of a two week closure at Christmas). The club is open to pupils from Pre-Reception to Year 6 and runs from 8.00am to 6.00pm.

For children in Pre-Reception and Reception, this takes place in the Early Years Centre and is staffed by St Joseph's Early Years practitioners.

For children in Years 1 to 6, a multi sports and activity club is run by St Joseph's College staff, with exciting and diverse challenges to suit everyone in this age group.

Cost per day (8.00am - 6.00pm) is £41.75

Cost per half day (8.00am -1.00pm or 1.00pm - 6.00pm) is £22.70

Cost per week is £208.10

There is an early booking discount for bookings made more than one month in advance: The early bird prices are £38.40 per day and £190.15 per week. No discounts are available for half days.

Holiday Club payments must be made at the time of booking. All bookings should be made via the online booking facility on the website. No refunds will be given for cancellations less than 24 hours in advance.

Holiday Club is open to both St Joseph's pupils and non-pupils, with priority given to pupils enrolled at the College.

## School Transport

The College offers a school minibus service from a number of areas including Maidenhead, Henley, Thatcham and Caversham, for which there is a charge of £9.12 per day. We also operate a service to and from Reading Station (charge of £3.95 per day). For details please contact the Bursary.

## Out of School Visits

Pupils have the opportunity to participate in a variety of out of school visits. My School Portal is used for payment of these visits, costs for which are not included in the fees.

## Withdrawal

Parents are required to give at least one term's written notice of withdrawal of their child from the school, from school transport and optional lessons such as music and speech and drama. This means that if you intend to withdraw your child before the start of the next academic year in September, you need to give notice by the first day of the start of the preceding summer term.

## Fees In Lieu of Notice

Failure to provide a full term's notice of withdrawal in writing will result in you being charged a term's fees in lieu of notice to cover the school's losses. We also require a term's notice if your child withdraws from optional lessons as these incur supplementary charges.
