Adverse Weather Procedures

Introduction

St Joseph's College will endeavour to stay open for as many pupils as possible for as long as possible and will aim to return to normality as soon as possible during any period of inclement weather, including snow.

Please note that no pupil, parent or staff member should travel to school if they cannot do so safely.

The College will restrict its opening if in the opinion of the Head, based on the best advice available to them at the time, the risk to pupils, parents and staff from travelling to school or remaining on site is too great.

If the adverse weather is likely to disrupt learning for more than 24 hours, we anticipate that we would move to remote learning wherever possible. This would, at a minimum, involve posting work on Teams for pupils to complete.

Please note the following sources of information that you will need to monitor during the period covered by the plan:

1. <u>www.sjcr.org.uk</u> The latest written update available to parents, pupils and staff will be available on the College **website homepage**

2. The latest detailed updates are available to staff via **email** AND in **Key Info** on the **SJCR Staff Team**

3. **SchoolPost** – Parents and Staff will receive SchoolPost messages to their email account registered with MSP and/or their mobile.

4. **Classlist** – With permission from the Parents' Association we will share information via Classlist

5. <u>http://news.bbc.co.uk/weather/forecast</u> Please search for the Reading area and note both the **5 DAY FORECAST** and the **NEXT 24 HOURS** forecast.

The following table references snow but we are aware in recent years that amber and red weather warnings have been issued for High Wind and other weather. The timing, severity and probability of these weather warnings will be considered when deciding whether the school can remain open.
